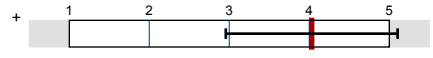

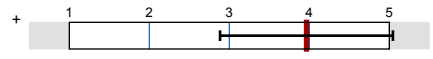

Global Index



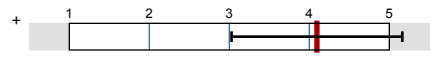

4.3) Approximately how many hours *per week* did you spend on this course outside of the classroom?



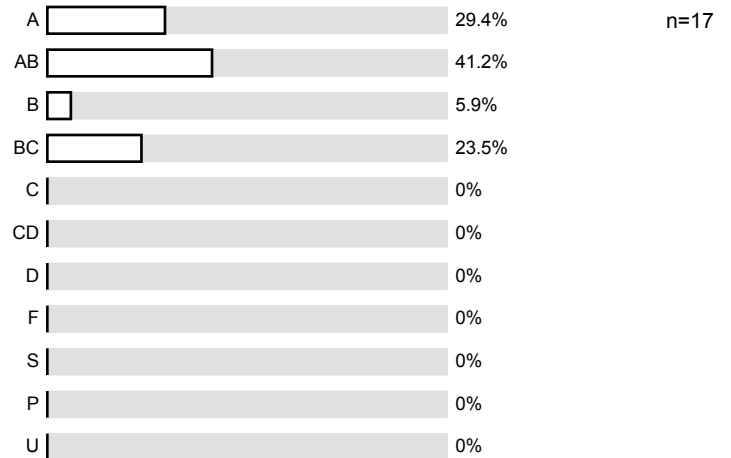

Comments Report

1. THE COURSE

1.3) Comments on class activities:

- All the activities in class stimulated intellectual growth and discussion
- I like the blog ideas and the discussion in class. It was really helpful in the learning experience and was great for the classroom environment.

- Both the midterm and final exams (the only 2 in the semester), were somewhat difficult and opinion-based. I think there should have been more, and more frequently, to help with learning the material as well as not negatively impacting the student's final grade in the class.
